6. **Arab Culture:** What inspirations can you draw upon?
7. **Educational Support:** If your educational settings supported you, how could you increase the impact of your project?
8. **Networking:** One person stays at your home table and the other three go to three different tables. Explore ways to network and enhance one another's projects (20 min)

9. **Return to Home Table:** Compare notes - In what way can networking help your project and that of others? Concrete examples? (15 min)
10. **Debrief:** Please debrief in your cluster of four tables. (8 min each)
